

Top Hotels in Bath

Bath's popularity as a tourist destination means that there is a wide range of hotels in the city. If you are looking for cheap Bath hotels, boutiques. Areas such as Stall Street, Union Street and the options include Travelodge Bath Central, which is located about a mile from the city's train station.



Another **budget hotel in Bath** is Travelodge Bath Waterside, Bath is located in the valley of the River Avon, about 13 miles which is located close to both the River Avon and the Kennett and southeast of Bristol and 97 miles west of London. Bath is Avon Canal. Other Bath hotels include the Macdonald Bath Spa, one of the city's finest 5-star hotels, and the Hilton Bath City, with its new Atelier Restaurant serving French cuisine.

Bath Transportation

Bath Spa station offers direct rail services to destinations including Bristol, London, Cardiff, Exeter, Plymouth and Portsmouth. The city and surrounding area is served by a network of buses, while long-distance National Express coaches also call in at Bath. Cyclists heading to Bristol can use the Bristol and Bath Railway Path, a 15-mile dedicated cycle route linking the two cities. Bristol is the closest airport to Bath, with services to many UK and European destinations.

Shopping in Bath

Bath has a good mix of well-known chain stores and independent SouthGate shopping centre feature many high street names, while you'll find many designer fashion stores around Milsom Place. The Upper Town, close to the Royal Crescent, has many boutiques and antique shops. The city's Artisan Quarter, around London Street and Walcot Street has many craft and curio shops, plus there's a flea market every Saturday.

Bath Attractions

The city of Bath is one of the most popular visitor destinations in the UK, thanks to its Roman ruins, spa, Georgian architecture and beautiful riverside setting.

The city of Bath is a UNESCO World Heritage Site, with a fine collection of architectural attractions. The Royal Crescent is perhaps the most famous, while Pulteney Bridge, which crosses the River Avon, is considered one of the world's most beautiful bridges. Bath has Britain's only hot spring, and at the Roman Baths you can see the magnificent bathhouse where the city's geothermal waters were exploited 2,000 years ago. Its modern day equivalent is Thermae Bath Spa, a new spa with more than 40 treatments on offer, plus a rooftop pool with magnificent views of one of the city's other top attractions, the 15th Century Bath Abbey. There are a number of fascinating museums and galleries in Bath, including the Jane Austen Centre, Victoria Art Gallery, Herschel Museum of Astronomy, the Fashion Museum and the American Museum in Britain.
